



OUR LIVING HOPE

Being hopeful about something is a wonderful feeling...



One Christmas - I was about 10 years old at the time, family small-talk had it that I may be in line for a new bicycle. It would be my first 'big' bike! I couldn't think or dream of anything else. Mom and Dad weren't letting on, but something in their tone of voice and awkward smiles made me hopeful. Christmas day dawned and there under a sheet in their bedroom was a green and gold second hand BSA bike with shiny chrome mud guards. It was a beauty! The hope-filled longings of my young heart had been fulfilled...all was well with my soul!

In an everyday sense, this kind of hope helps us imagine a better or brighter future when it comes to family life, friendships, health, finances and many other matters. It motivates us to eat better and get more exercise. To work harder and save more money, to be kind and considerate and always to look for the silver lining in situations. Such hope-filled attitudes and actions leave us feeling better about ourselves and the world around us. Without it, life can seem bleak and empty. But this kind of hope, important as it is, can also be fragile. It can blind us to the harsh realities of life and set us up for disappointment because it's often based on wishful thinking and our mistaken expectations of others and the circumstances, we find ourselves in. Proverbs 13:12 tells us... *"When hope is crushed, the heart is crushed."* When things we hope for don't materialise or are unreasonably delayed, we can sink into despair, anxiety or even physical illness. But there is another kind of hope. A hope that isn't based on the fanciful longings of our hearts or the flimsy promises of others. It's a hope that's deeply rooted in the character and promises of Almighty God. A hope that finds its fulfilment in the '*redemption*' He accomplished through the death and resurrection of Jesus Christ.



The theme of redemption runs through the Bible. The word 'redeem' means 'to buy out' and was often used to refer to the purchase of a slave's freedom. In scripture, the history of redemption is the story of God's plan to save mankind from slavery and sin. At various times according to the Old Testament, property, animals, people and the whole nation of Israel were all redeemed by the payment of a price. God redeemed Israel from slavery in Egypt at great cost – the significant expenditure of divine power through His outstretched arm and mighty hand (Ex 6:6), and the shed blood of a Passover lamb (Ex 12).

When it comes to the New Testament, the plight of mankind is not so much a physical matter - the backbreaking labour in Egypt - but rather a moral one. We're all dominated and enslaved by a power much greater than that of Egypt - the power of sin. Therefore, the cost of our redemption was infinitely higher...nothing less than the precious blood of Christ, an unblemished sacrificial Lamb of God (1 Pet 1:18-9). This price was paid at Calvary where blood flowed down His broken body, splattering on the dusty ground below His cross. Inky darkness hid Christ's agony as He was made sin for us and forsaken by His Father. A deep, almost unimaginable sorrow filled the Father's heart as He turned His face away from His beloved Son.

Will we ever understand the staggering cost of our redemption?

The events of Calvary took place on what the Christian Church celebrates as Good Friday. It's called 'good' because of what was accomplished through Christ's sacrifice as he laid down His life to redeem us. For His disciples though, there was nothing good about that Friday – all hope seemed lost: evil and death had triumphed.



But that was Friday, and Sunday was coming! At first light that Sunday, the earth reeled and rocked as God's angel rolled away the heavy stone used to seal Jesus' tomb. It was empty! Shafts of lightening blazed from the angel as he declared "Jesus is risen from the dead!"

What a momentous event! Jesus' resurrection from the dead was decisive proof that He'd not died in vain.

Mankind's debt of sin had finally been cancelled, and its sting – death – had been conquered. In raising Jesus from the dead, God brought 'living hope' to us all. Hope not only for this life but hope of life beyond the grave for all who believe in Him – we can be certain of the future because of what happened in the past.


This is how Peter the Apostle explains the significance of what happened...

What a God we have! And how fortunate we are to have him, this Father of our Master Jesus! Because Jesus was raised from the dead, we've been given a brand-new life and a living hope that includes a future in heaven—and the future starts now! God is keeping careful watch over us and the future. The Day is coming when you'll have it all—life healed and whole. So be truly glad! There is wonderful joy ahead, even though the going is rough for a while down here.

1 Peter 1:3-6

Easter is a loving remembrance of the death of Jesus Christ and a celebration of His resurrection. You too can be given a 'brand-new life and a Living Hope'. If you haven't yet come to faith in Jesus, Easter time is a wonderful opportunity to consider doing so.



"New internal structures to enhance PlumRus Service Delivery was launched Monday the 17th of March and Monday the 24th of March.

On Monday the 17th of March a new position of Flats Supervisor was launched, under the management of Rhodene Koense, PlumRus Care Services Manager. This position is filled by Lenore Jacobs and her primary responsibilities will be quality control of paid-for services delivered in the flats and as an extra hand, under the direction of Rhodene, to assist where deemed necessary.



On Monday the 24th of March the Cleaning & Laundry Department was enhanced with the addition of two supervisors. These roles are filled by Praxia Petersen and Gladys Gordon. Their primary responsibilities will be the execution of cross-contamination protocols in the bathrooms, showers, toilets, and sluices of PlumRus, as well as quality control of the work of our domestic, facility and laundry staff.



These staff members will report to me weekly, in addition to the weekly reporting by Mervyn and Clayton of RiskMan, as to the quality of work rendered within these Departments as well as adherence to our service delivery standards for purposes of correction and ongoing training.

The implementation of these two steps represents Steps 7 & 8 of my two year 9-Step plan for internal restructuring, as shared with residents during our small group meetings during the month of January 2025."



Our Facility Carers have each received their own cleaning trolley, which will assist them with the improvement of our cleaning standards throughout the facility.

The PlumRus stork was very busy on the 12th March. Carer Jermaine Solomons gave birth to a son, Azrael Jaron (left), at 08:08 the





- Thank you to the Plumrus staff who did their job admirably and to those who went the second mile.
- To the many visitors, thank-you for popping in. It was exciting to see whose face followed the knock, especially those who had to use the stairs or the far-lift to get here.
- Thanks to the many messengers who "ran down the road" to the mall on my behalf.
- What a food chain we set up: bananas in lieu of flowers, chocolate for later (it's now later!), cake for other visitors, who usually had to make their own tea, late harvest hanepoot grapes, thoughtful meals delivered on walker wheels.
- Thanks for the fragrant lavender "bossies", fridge magnets, lemongrass sachets, encouraging handwritten notes and shared Scriptures
- Thanks for the experimental, chaperoned trips to the coffee shop to see if I could walk that far.

If you are still reading this, you will have gathered that what started as a simple "thank you" has ended up as an essay on **Living in Community**.

We probably all subscribe to the adage "Love your neighbour as yourself," but in its Scriptural context, it reads: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and soul and mind and your neighbour as yourself. Your neighbour is sandwiched between God and yourself. Love for one's neighbour begins with love for God, which is only really possible if the sin barrier between us has been overcome by His Love (John 3 v 16)

Intriguing is that we are told to go ahead and love ourselves! That will be the identity trigger that makes love for our neighbour possible.

How to really love your neighbour? **LISTEN > LOVE >REPEAT**

LISTEN: I had an aunt (by marriage) to whom I would never pose the question "How are you?", for fear she would tell me! I know better now to listen attentively to others, but to mostly shut up about myself. If we all did that, the equation would balance itself. Of course, to listen to someone, you need to know and use their name and take the time to stop and chat.

LOVE: All the above thank-you's was for deliberate gestures inspired by folk who reached out.

REPEAT: You are encouraged to come out of isolation, build bridges of Grace, strengthen the ties that remain, Pay it forward, Pray it forward, Bloom where you are or whatever your mantra of the moment is.

Building a Family Tree (Part 1): Introduction

To the questions, "Do you know your grandparents?" "Do your children know their grandparents?" many may say "of course they do, we are a closely connected family" others, (like myself) will say, "I haven't a clue... they died before I was born... or when I was young... or they lived in another country". If you did not know your grandparents, then there is a very high likelihood that your children will not know them either.

This is the value of building a Family Tree – connecting long deceased family members with our present generation and the next. A Family Tree can be as detailed as one wants it – as wide as one would like it and as far back as one would like to go – depending on the availability of records.

Essential to building an accurate Family Tree is the locating of those records that verify the data of individuals in the Tree – dates of birth, christening, date and place of marriage, details of spouse, children, date and place of decease etc. Fortunately, there are many such records that are now available online.

What format should one use to record one's Family Tree? Firstly, a large sheet of paper, or a standard available form initially, is the simplest to record the basic information and relationships of family members. But it is rather limited and not easy to change without redoing it. But it all depends on how much detail one wants to include.

Secondly, a free/or paid for program on the internet provides flexibility and ease with which to share the Tree with others. Such a Tree has no limits and can also be discovered by others. But obviously this method has drawbacks – one drawback is that one needs access to the Internet.

One aim of a Family Tree is to record the details of one's ancestors for one's own sake as well as being a record accessible to one's descendants who may wish to know "where they came from."

All this sounds deadly (no pun intended) dull and boring, tedious and terribly complicated. But it need not be so – although there could be severe challenges. Rather, it can be fascinating, interesting, and enlightening. For example, my wife is a trained High School Mathematics teacher. Unlike me, our son is also good at Mathematics, as well as one of our granddaughters. We discovered that my wife's grandfather was awarded a University Scholarship in Mathematics to an English University! It appears that his obvious gifting in Mathematics was passed down to his granddaughter and great grandchildren!

Each of us may have vital information about our particular family that some future family member may wish we had recorded it in some way and passed it on. So, pass on what you know while there is opportunity!
